The Tutoring and Learning Center (TLC) is a space for Pacific University students. We exist to provide academic support to students during their time at Pacific. Sunday through Thursday we offer tutoring in mathematics, science, writing, and foreign language, but that is only the beginning. This past year we have added technology tutors one night a week. Need a quiet place to study during the day? The TLC is available for you to use. Want to get a study group together? Feel free to use our space. With large tables, comfy chairs, cold and hot water, and a Keurig coffee machine; the TLC is waiting to serve you. Our Director can also help you if you need academic coaching or just a little TLC you may not be able to find anywhere else on campus. When you arrive inside the TLC you must first sign in at the check in/out computer located in the front of the TLC/CLIC entrance, this is very important. You must sign in before you locate a tutor to help you. In the event we do not have a tutor to help you just sign out and email the director at yisland@pacificu.edu. The director will do her best to help you find the support you need on campus in your particular subject. When you leave the TLC it is equally important that you sign out and record the name of the tutor who assisted you. Remember that the TLC is a shared space so it is important that we clean up behind ourselves. Our tutors are your fellow students, and while they are well versed in their subject area they may need a moment to refresh on what you are learning. Also tutors are not here to give you answers but to guide your learning and get you over a stumbling point in your assignment so you can press on. You are free to stay and study after you have seen your tutor in case you have other questions. When there are no students to serve in the TLC, you may find tutors doing their homework, feel free to tap them on the shoulder, say hi, and ask for assistance.
