Pacific University's Master of Science in SLP program is committed to developing exceptional critical thinkers who become leaders in their diverse communities. To achieve these objectives, the program will:

Cultivate an Inclusive Learning Environment

Develop Leaders and Advocates

- Integrate advocacy training: Equip students with the skills and knowledge to champion communication access for underserved populations.
- **Promote scholarly activity:** Encourage faculty and student involvement in research, presentations, and professional organizations.
